## What is CLA? Where did it come from?

- Informed by existing practice inside & outside USAID

- “CLA” developed with Uganda, adopted by 20+ Missions
- Many IPs are way ahead of USAID

## Why CLA?

*Because we keep getting the same things wrong.*

- Data & evidence stay on the shelf, programs have weak evidence base
- Outdated practices are still used
- Programs have a poor fit with context

## Why CLA?

*Because we keep getting the same things wrong.*

- Plans & implementation approaches are static
- Coordination is lacking, synergy is lost
- Development is donor-driven, not country-led
- Implementation modes assume service delivery to passive “beneficiaries”

## CLA in CDCS

Fill gaps in evidence base

- analytic agenda: research, synthesis
- evaluations

Ground strategy in context

- game-changers
- advisory partners
- adaptive management

Build on experience

- candid conversations
- positive deviance

Resources, staff and incentives for collaborating, learning and adapting





## CLA in Project Design

- Design project within broader context
- Program influence as well as dollars
- Choose flexible mechanisms
- Define deliverables to promote collaborating, learning and adapting
- New project construct requires IP coordination and collaborative learning
- Support it within/across projects (embedded, standalone)
- Catalyze learning for local development actors

## CLA During Implementation

- Plan research, synthesis and periodic review to strengthen and update analytics
- Build learning focus into partners' meetings and portfolio reviews
- Capture learning from departing staff
- Institute informal, cross-sectoral discussion forums on game changers
- Fund IPs to capture and share learning (their own and others')



## Adaptive management

Based on new learning or changes in context, make iterative course corrections to increase effectiveness

- Build flexibility into funding mechanisms
- Monitor performance but also broader context indicators, emergent trends, and other actors' activities and results
- Build iterative reflection into management processes
- Expect to need to adapt, and do so as soon as evidence indicates a more effective path is available
- Reward learning & adapting, not staying the course

## Adaptive management examples

- **Portfolio Reviews**
  - Expanded to ask: What are we learning? Is implementation leading to results? Do we need to change course?
- **“Big Picture” reflections**
  - Multi-stakeholder reflection to ground-truth USAID programs in broader context of dynamic country conditions, emergent technical knowledge, and evolving assistance landscape
- **Advisory groups**
  - Local thought leaders engaged to bring local context and knowledge/experience to bear on strategic planning, project design, and program implementation

## What we're doing to move this forward

- Building capacity within USAID
- Bringing partners into the conversation
- Sourcing and sharing examples
- Building lateral networks (such as this one?)
- Making the case for doing development differently
- Cracking the M&E nut
